GNOME Foundation's Budget - 2011

This is a brief summary of the categories, items, expenses and incomes for the GNOME Foundation's Budget for the fiscal year 2011. This document is complementary to the spreadsheet and it was written as a reference to help clarify the meaning of terms.

Key expense categories

The main ones, in order of occurrence are:

- · Accessibility (A11y).
- Administrivia: Fixed costs the GNOME Foundation must incur across the year. This includes things like our fax number and post office box.
- Employees: Payroll, taxes, bonuses and expenses related with having contracted employees.
- · Hackfests.
- Local outreach: GNOME events organized by local groups.
- · Friends of GNOME.
- · Marketing.
- · Mobile.
- Women's outreach: Activities related to increase the participation of Women in GNOME.

Key income categories

The main ones, in order of occurrence are:

- Accessibility (A11y).
- Adboad: Advisory Board fees coming from companies that sponsor GNOME.
- Affiliate programs: Amazon and The GNOME Store (hosted on Zazzle).
- Events: Income from events, specially from sponsors.
- Hackfest: Most of this income comes from companies willing to sponsor the event.
- · Friends of GNOME.
- Interest: Money received from the bank and a 5% of administrative fee to groups for handling their money.
- Marketing & sales. This is from the sale of GNOME merchandising either on the GNOME store or at events.
- Other Corporation donations: Income given by companies to accomplish a given task.
- Other: Income that is not related with any other category.
- Women's outreach: Donations received to help increase the participation of women in GNOME.

Events & Hackfests

Events

Events is composed of several subcategories, some of them are big GNOME events, as it is shown in the table 3.

Travel & Lodging is what we expect to spend across the year to support contributors to attend GNOME events. It is intended primarily to bring GNOME Foundation members to our events.

Boston Summit. Boston Summit is a cross between an event and a hackfest. It has typically been an event where many GNOME contributors work together on projects such as GNOME 3.0.

GUADEC/Desktop Summit. This is our main annual conference. The projected income is conservative. The expected expenses (\$65,700) are divided between Travel & Lodging and the organization itself. The income and expenses expected will be shared by KDE and GNOME.

Both *Event Boxes* (US and EU) are expected to be upgraded and/or get replacements for missing parts.

Other events. This is a special provision to help developers attend FOSS evemts on behalf of GNOME. Some of the events where GNOME will consider a presence include: OSiM World, OSCON, CSUN, Open Source World, SCALE/WiOS, LinuxCon, OSBC, OSiM USA, Collaboration Summit, LinuxTag, Open World Forum, FISL, Women in Computing, CeBIT/FOSS, LinuxConf Australia, OpenSUSE, RedHat Summit, Maemo Summit, Ubuntu Desktop Summit.

Executive Director's travel. Because the Executive Director's role is being the face and voice of GNOME at events where it is important for GNOME be present, there is a budget assigned under this category, which does not include the months without Executive Director.

If, for some reason, our Executive Director is unable to accept an invitation, she may give the chance to a contributor to represent GNOME. Hence, the budget may combined with *Other events* as needed.

We are hoping that by combining the Executive Director's travel into the general event bucket, we will be able to provide travel assistance for people to attend events for GNOME.

Hackfests

There were 10 hackfests in the previous year, and it is expected a similar number of hackfest for the next one. Hackfest have been a success inside the community and have helped to accelerate the development of key areas of the project.

The income expected is conservative, and it is half of the income received during the previous year. It is worth mentioning that some hackfests receive more funds than others. Nevertheless, with the current budget the Board of Directors plans to hold several hackfests whether or not we receive additional funding.

Women & Local Outreach

Women's outreach

A women's outreach program was planned originally for the past term. It was delayed to the summer in the southern hemisphere (December to March) and 8 applicants have been chosen from the 34 received. Also, we are planning to run the same program in parallel to the next Google Summer of Code. It is expected that the program will raise money from companies to pay interns because the size of the program is determined by the amount of money raised.

Local outreach

There are three local events with a strong local community which might need funds:

Fórum do GNOME in Brazil is an event which usually takes inside of another conference, where a big number of attendants are expected every year.

GNOME.Asia will hold its fourth annual event to coincidewith the release of GNOME 3.0 in April, 2011. The exact time and place will be decided on November.

GNOME Day is held as part of Encuentro Linux, an event which is held in a different Chilean university every year. It is the most important event related to FOSS in Chile.

Marketing

The expenses are related to our Marketing costs, printing and postage for items like the Annual report, contracts to prepare marketing materials, and a campaign for the release of GNOME 3.

GNOME Foundatio is preparing to hire a new Executive Director as soon as possible. The idea of contracting a specialist in marketing to support GNOME 3.0 has been discussed, but a decision has not yet been made.

It has been proposed to increase the working hours of the Administrative Assistant, which is explained by the constant increase of the load of work in the last couple of years. It could be increased from 20 hours a week to 30 or 35 hours a week.
